John 10

1"I tell you the truth, the man who does not enter the sheep pen by the gate, but climbs in by some other way, is a thief and a robber. ²The man who enters by the gate is the shepherd of his sheep. ³The watchman opens the gate for him, and the sheep listen to his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. 4When he has brought out all his own, he goes on ahead of them, and his sheep follow him because they know his voice. ⁵But they will never follow a stranger; in fact, they will run away from him because they do not recognize a stranger's voice." ⁶Jesus used this figure of speech, but they did not understand what he was telling them.

⁷Therefore Jesus said again, "I tell you the truth, I am the gate for the sheep. ⁸All who ever came before me were thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. ⁹I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. He will come in and go out, and find pasture. ¹⁰The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.

¹¹"I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for

the sheep. ¹²The hired hand is not the shepherd who owns the sheep. So when he sees the wolf coming, he abandons the sheep and runs away. Then the wolf attacks the flock and scatters it. ¹³The man runs away because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep.

¹⁴"I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me-¹⁵just as the Father knows me and I know the Father—and I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶I have other sheep that are not of this sheep pen. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd. ¹⁷The reason my Father loves me is that I lay down my life—only to take it up again. ¹⁸No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down and authority to take it up again. This command I received from my Father."

¹⁹At these words the Jews were again divided. ²⁰Many of them said, "He is demon-possessed and raving mad. Why listen to him?"

²¹But others said, "These are not the sayings of a man possessed by a demon. Can a demon open the eyes of the blind?"







CRAFT/ACTIVITY: SHEEP

Students will make sheep to remind them that Jesus is the good shepherd.

MATERIALS

- 1. 67 lb. Cardstock
- 2. Sheep Pattern
- 3. Crayons, markers, or colored pencils
- 4. Scissors
- 5. Glue
- 6. Cotton Balls
- 7. Paper Plates (small and large)



DIRECTIONS

- 1. Make copies of the "Sheep Pattern" onto 67lb. cardstock for each student.
- 2. Have students color the sheep body parts.
- 3. Have students cut out each of the pieces and glue them to the paper plates.
- 4. Allow students to glue cotton balls onto the paper plate as well.

FOR DISCUSSION

As students are working on their sheep, remind them of the symbolism used in the story. Jesus is like a shepherd who takes care of his sheep (those who believe in him). Help students realize that, like a shepherd, Jesus loves and cares for each one of us.







THE GOOD SHEPHERD



Jesus taught the crowd about shepherds. He said a shepherd loves and cares for his sheep. The sheep know the shepherd's

voice and they follow him. The shepherd knows each of the sheep by name. The sheep do not follow a stranger because they do not recognize the stranger's voice.

Then Jesus compared himself to a shepherd and his followers to sheep. Jesus said, "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. I know my sheep and my sheep know me. I lay down my life for the sheep".

The Jewish people who were listening to Jesus did not understand what Jesus was saying. Many of them thought Jesus was crazy or demon-possessed.

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
Ideas For Home:

- 5. Explain that Jesus loves us all like a shepherd loves his sheep. He died to take away our sin.






