PRESCHOOL GAME

Supplies: Red fabric (a sheet, a towel, or a blanket) and soft balls or paper wads

Get ready for fun as your preschoolers become the plagues of Egypt.

ay: Today we will see what God did to show Pharaoh who was really the King. When Moses told Pharaoh to let the Israelites go, Pharaoh said "no" ten times. Let's act out the ten miracles God did to show Pharaoh that God was the King. First, God turned Aaron's stick into a snake. Have the children lay down on their stomachs and wiggle like snakes. Say: Second, God turned the river into blood. Have the children wave the red fabric up and down like a river current. Say: Third, God sent frogs to cover the land. Have the children hop up and down like frogs. Say: Fourth, God filled the air with gnats. Have the children wave their arms like they're swatting gnats. Say: Fifth, God let the cows die all at once. Have the children stand on all fours and then fall down on the count of three. Say: Sixth, God gave the people sores all over their bodies. Have the children hop up and down and yell "ouch!" Say: Seventh, he sent hail falling down from the sky. Have the children throw the soft balls or paper wads up into the air. Say: Eighth, he sent a swarm of locusts to cover the land. Have the children hop on all fours while chomping with their mouths. Say: Ninth, he turned the daylight into darkness. Have the children close their eyes for a few seconds. Say: Tenth, he allowed some Egyptian children to die, but he protected all the Hebrew children. Have the children clap and cheer.


After resting for a moment, repeat the plagues more rapidly. Try it in slow motion for even more fun.

Moses tells Pharaoh to let the Israelites go or else bad things will happen

Exodus 7:14-11:10

CRAFT/ACTIVITY: BIBLE CONCENTRATION

Students will play Bible Concentration to help them remember the ten plagues that the Egyptians suffered through because Pharaoh would not let the Israelites go.

MATERIALS

- 1. White 67 lb. Cardstock
- 2. Bible Concentration Master
- 3. Scissors
- 4. Paper Clips

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Copy the Bible Concentration Master onto 67 lb. cardstock for each student.
- 2. Cut the cards into pieces on the black lines.
- 3. Turn all the cards face down on the table.
- 4. With a partner, students will take turns turning over two cards at a time.
- 5. If a student matches two cards, he/she keeps the cards.
- 6. If the cards do not match, both cards are turned back over and the next player attempts to match two cards.
- 7. Both players take turns until all cards have been matched.
- 8. The player with the most cards at the end wins.
- 9. Give each student a paper clip to clip his/her cards together.

For Discussion

As students are cutting up their cards, remind them that God made Pharaoh's heart hard to the idea of letting the Israelites go. Ten horrible plagues had to occur before Pharaoh would let the people go. Our memory verse reminds us to fear the Lord and serve Him faithfully with all your heart. We need not be like Pharaoh who had no fear of God. We need to faithfully serve God.







everything I tell you. He will not listen to you. But after many acts of judgment, Pharaoh will let my people leave Egypt."

Moses and Aaron went to Pharaoh. Aaron threw down his staff and it became a snake. Pharaoh found magicians to do the same. Pharaoh did not want to let God's people leave Egypt.

Ten bad things, called plagues, had to happen before the Pharaoh finally let God's people leave Egypt.

- 1. The Nile River was turned to blood.
- 2. Frogs filled the river and the land.
- 3. The dust turned into gnats and covered the men and animals.
- 4. Flies filled Egypt and ruined the land.
- 5. All the Egyptians' livestock died.
- 6. Boils broke out on the Egyptians and their animals.
- 7. Hail came down and hit plants, people, and animals.
- 8. Locust ate everything left in the land.
- 9. Darkness covered all of Egypt for three days.
- 10. Every firstborn son in Egypt died.




