



The shepherd counts his sheep. One is missing. The shepherd goes to look for it.



CRAFT/ACTIVITY: SHEEP PUPPETS

Students will make a sheep puppet to remind them of how the shepherd will leave 99 sheep that are safe to go after 1 that is lost.

MATERIALS

- 1. 67 lb. Cardstock
- 2. Sheep Head Pattern
- 3. Crayons, Markers, or Colored Pencils
- 4. Scissors
- 5. Glue
- 6. Cotton Balls
- 7. Paper Lunch Sacks



DIRECTIONS

- 1. Make copies of the "Sheep Head Pattern" onto 67lb. cardstock for each student.
- 2. Have students color the sheep head.
- 3. Have students cut out the sheep head on the solid black lines.
- 4. Allow students to glue cotton balls onto sheep head.
- 5. Glue the sheep head to the bottom of a paper lunch sack.
- 6. Glue a cotton ball on the back of the bag for a tail.
- 7. If time permits, hide one of the sheep puppets outside and have students look for it.

FOR DISCUSSION

As students are working on their sheep puppets, remind them of how Jesus is like the shepherd in the parable. Jesus will go after even one lost soul. He cares enough to seek us out that we might not be lost. Jesus wants to be our Lord and Savior. Invite students to receive Christ as their Savior. Ask them to pray a prayer like, "Dear Jesus, Thank you for dying on the cross for my sins. Please forgive me for the bad things I've done. Please come into my heart and be my Lord and Savior. Amen."




SHEEP HEAD PATTERN



PRESCHOOL GAME

Supplies: None

Children will seek for lost sheep in this game that builds language and observation skills.

ave the children stand in a circle.

Say: Jesus is the Good Shepherd who knows each one of his sheep. When one is lost, he goes and finds it. I am going to pretend to be a shepherd, but I need someone to help me find my sheep.

Choose a child to stand with you in the center of the circle.

Say: I am going to describe my lost sheep to you. As soon as you think you know who it is, go and get the sheep and bring it to me.

Begin describing one of the other children. State the "sheep's" hair color, describe his or her clothes, and name any other distinctive characteristics. When your helper has correctly identified the child you were describing, direct the helper to stand in the circle and allow the sheep to be your new helper. Continue until all the children have been "found."
