⁴They traveled from Mount Hor along the route to the Red Sea, to go around Edom. But the people grew impatient on the way; ⁵they spoke against God and against Moses, and said, “Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the desert? There is no bread! There is no water! And we detest this miserable food!”

⁶Then the LORD sent venomous snakes among them; they bit the people and many Israelites died. ⁷The people came to Moses

and said, “We sinned when we spoke against the LORD and against you. Pray that the LORD will take the snakes away from us.” So Moses prayed for the people.

⁹So Moses made a bronze snake and put it up on a pole. Then when anyone was bitten by a snake and looked at the bronze snake, he lived.

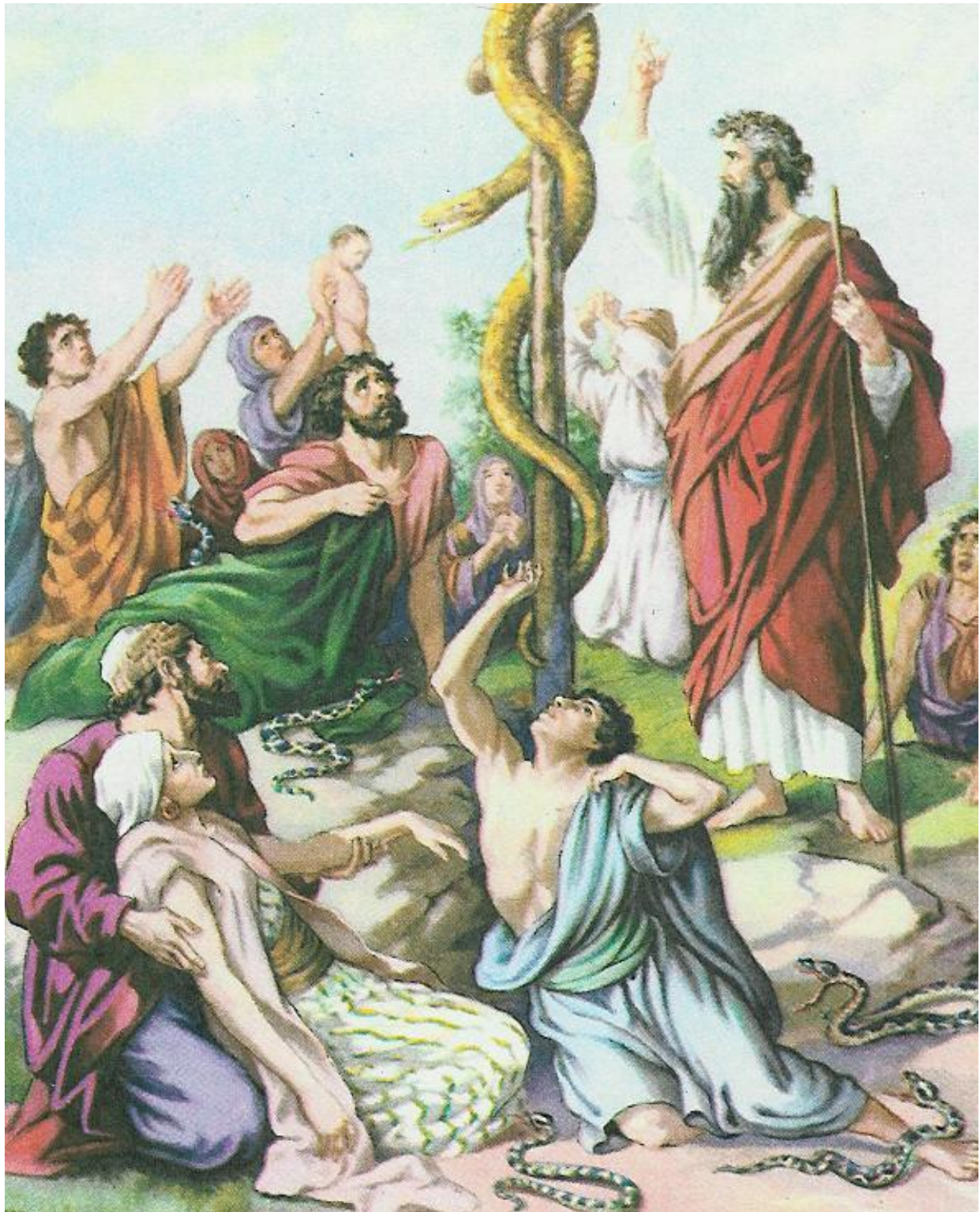

Numbers 21:4-9

CRAFT/ACTIVITY: CLAY SERPENTS

Students will make clay serpents on a pole (drinking straw) to remind them that the Israelites had to look up to the brass serpent to live if they had been bitten by a venomous snake.

MATERIALS

1. 2 cups flour
2. 1 cup salt
3. 2/3 cup water
4. Bowl for mixing
5. Measuring cup
6. Wax Paper for each student
7. Drinking straws



DIRECTIONS

1. Mix the flour and salt together in a bowl first. Then add in water slowly. Squeeze the dough with your hands until it is smooth. If the play dough is crumbly, add more water. If the play dough is too wet, sprinkle it with flour.
2. Pass out a small piece of wax paper and a small lump of play dough to each student.
3. Instruct them to roll it out into a snake.
4. Have students coil the “snake” around a plastic drinking straw.
5. Play dough will air dry over time (up to a week).

FOR DISCUSSION

As students are rolling out their snakes, remind them that God sent the venomous snakes to bite the Israelites as a result of their complaining. When the Israelites realized that they had sinned, they begged Moses to pray to the Lord to take away the snakes. Though God did not take the snakes away, he did have Moses make a bronze snake and put it on a pole. Anyone that was bitten could look up to the snake and live. Help students realize that today, when we are bitten by sin, we too, can look up; not to a snake, but to Jesus for forgiveness.

The Israelites continued to travel through the desert from Mount Hor to the Red Sea. They traveled that route because the king of Edom would not let them pass through

his land.

The Israelites grew impatient and started to complain once again. They spoke against God and Moses saying, “Why have you brought us out of Egypt to die in the desert? There is nothing good to eat and no water out here!”

Then the Lord sent poisonous snakes to bite the people. Many of the Israelites died.

Some of the people came to Moses and said, “We sinned when we spoke against the Lord and you. Pray that the Lord will take the snakes away from us.”

Then the Lord told Moses to make a bronze snake and put it up on a pole. Anyone who got bit by a snake could look up at the snake and live.

This is a good lesson for us today. Anytime we have trouble, we can look up too. Today, we don’t look up at a bronze snake. We look to God!
