Genesis 7

¹The LORD then said to Noah, "Go into the ark, you and your whole family, because I have found you righteous in this generation. ²Take with you seven of every kind of clean animal, a male and its mate, and two of every kind of unclean animal, a male and its mate, ³and also seven of every kind of bird, male and female, to keep their various kinds alive throughout the earth. ⁴Seven days from now I will send rain on the earth for forty days and forty nights, and I will wipe from the face of the earth every living creature I have made."

⁵And Noah did all that the LORD commanded him.

⁶Noah was six hundred years old when the floodwaters came on the earth. ⁷And Noah and his sons and his wife and his sons' wives entered the ark to escape the waters of the flood. ⁸Pairs of clean and unclean animals, of birds and of all creatures that move along the ground, ⁹male and female, came to Noah and entered the ark, as God had commanded Noah. ¹⁰And after the seven days the floodwaters came on the earth.

¹¹In the six hundredth year of Noah's life, on the seventeenth day of the second month—on that day all the springs of the great deep burst forth, and the floodgates of the heavens were opened. ¹²And rain fell on the earth forty days and forty nights.

¹³On that very day Noah and his sons, Shem, Ham and Japheth, together with his wife and the wives of his three sons, entered the ark. ¹⁴They had with them every wild animal according to its kind, all livestock according to their kinds, every creature that moves along the ground according to its kind and every bird according to its kind, everything with wings. ¹⁵Pairs of all creatures that have the breath of life in them came to Noah and entered the ark. ¹⁶The animals going in were male and female of every living thing, as God had commanded Noah. Then the LORD shut him in.

¹⁷For forty days the flood kept coming on the earth, and as the waters increased they lifted the ark high above the earth. ¹⁸The waters rose and increased greatly on the earth, and the ark floated on the surface of the water. ¹⁹They rose greatly on the earth, and all the high mountains under the entire heavens were covered. ²⁰The waters rose and covered the mountains to a depth of more than twenty feet. ²¹Every living thing that moved on the earth perished birds, livestock, wild animals, all the creatures that swarm over the earth, and all mankind. ²²Everything on dry land that had the breath of life in its nostrils died.

²³Every living thing on the face of the earth was wiped out; men and animals and the creatures that move along the ground and the birds of the air were wiped from the earth. Only Noah was left, and those with him in the ark.

²⁴The waters flooded the earth for a hundred and fifty days.



CRAFT/ACTIVITY: BIBLE CONCENTRATION

Students will play Bible Concentration to help them remember that God told Noah to bring two of every kind of animal onto the ark

MATERIALS

- 1. White 67 lb. Cardstock
- 2. Bible Concentration Master
- 3. Scissors
- 4. Crayon, Markers, or Colored Pencils
- 5. Paper Clips

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Copy two (2) Bible Concentration Masters onto 67 lb. cardstock for each student.
- 2. Have students color the animals.
- 3. Cut the cards into pieces on the black lines.
- 4. Turn all the cards face down on the table.
- 5. With a partner, students will take turns turning over two cards at a time.
- 6. If a student matches two cards, he/she keeps the cards.
- 7. If the cards do not match, both cards are turned back over and the next player attempts to match two cards.
- 8. Both players take turns until all cards have been matched.
- 9. The player with the most cards at the end wins.
- 10. Give each student a paper clip to clip his/her cards together.

For Discussion

As students are coloring their cards, help them realize that each of the pairs of animals brought onto the ark was for the purpose of reproducing after the ark came to rest. Mankind (and all the animals) had to be destroyed due to their wickedness. This was God's way of dealing with sin. Later, God would send his own son to die in our place. Jesus would take our sin upon himself so that we would not pay for our sin. Give students an opportunity to receive Christ as their personal Lord and Savior so that they will not continue down the road that leads to destruction. Review the verse below with the students.







Today your child learned how God destroyed the earth because of sin.


- 1. Have your child finish coloring this book.



PRESCHOOL GAME

Supplies: A piece of rope or a board for a tightrope, a blanket draped over a table or two chairs for a tunnel, paper-circle steppingstones for crossing a river, two chairs put together for a mountain, a table on its side for an ark, and a spray bottle filled with water

Bring the story of Noah and the ark to life in this awesome obstacle course.

some of them must have had to travel a long way to get there on time. Today we'll travel the way some of them did to get safely on the ark.

Explain the course to the children as you build it. Lay the rope or board on the floor, and identify it as a long tree branch to climb over. Drape the blanket over a table or two chairs, and tell the kids it's a cave to climb through. Place the paper circles as steppingstones to help children cross a wide river. Put two chairs together


back-to-back to make a tall mountain to climb. Show the tipped-over table that will be the ark.

Lead the children through the course from beginning to end, misting them all with water as they climb into the ark. Then let one of

the kids pick an animal, and have everyone try the course again as that animal. Once everyone has had a chance to choose an animal, let all the kids make their favorite animal noises from inside the ark!
