
Genesis 11:1-9

CRAFT/ACTIVITY: THE TILTING TOWER

Students will make a tower to remind them that God was displeased with the people's plan to make a name for themselves.

MATERIALS

- 1. 67 lb White Cardstock
- 2. Tower Pattern
- 3. Crayons, Markers, or Colored Pencils
- 4. Tape
- 5. Scissors



DIRECTIONS

- 1. Make a copy of the "Tower Pattern" onto 67 lb white cardstock for each student.
- 2. Allow the students to color the bricks on the tower pattern.
- 3. Next, students should cut out their tower on the solid black lines.
- 4. Help students tape end "A" to end "B" to make a cylindrical tower.

FOR DISCUSSION

As students are coloring their towers, remind them how the people at that time had one language. They wanted to make a name for themselves and God was not pleased. God confused their language and scattered the people over all the earth. We do not please God when we do things out of selfish ambition. Review the memory verse with your students.



Genesis 11

¹Now the whole world had one language and a common speech. ²As men moved eastward, they found a plain in Shinar and settled there.

They said to each other, "Come, let's make bricks and bake them thoroughly." They used brick instead of stone, and tar for mortar. ⁴Then they said, "Come, let us build ourselves a city, with a tower that reaches to the heavens, so that we may make a name for ourselves and not be scattered over the face of the whole earth."

⁵But the LORD came down to see the city and the tower that the men

were building. ⁶The LORD said, "If as one people speaking the same language they have begun to do this, then nothing they plan to do will be impossible for them.

⁷Come, let us go down and confuse their language so they will not understand each other."

*So the LORD scattered them from there over all the earth, and they stopped building the city. That is why it was called Babel—because there the LORD confused the language of the whole world. From there the LORD scattered them over the face of the whole earth.





Genesis 11:1-9

CRAFT/ACTIVITY: THE TILTING TOWER

Students will make a tower out of blocks to remind them of how the people tried to build a tower to reach the heavens.

MATERIALS

1. Wood/Cardboard Building Blocks

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Bring in children's building blocks.
- 2. Allow each student in class to add one block at a time to the tower until it falls.
- 3. Repeat, as time permits.

FOR DISCUSSION

As students are building the tower, remind them how the people at that time had one language. They wanted to make a name for themselves and God was not pleased. God confused their language and scattered the people over all the earth. We do not please God when we do things out of selfish ambition. Review the memory verse with your students.


God was not happy. He made it so that the people could not talk to each other anymore.

PRESCHOOL GAME

Supplies: building blocks

Kids will play this simple game over and over after hearing the story of the Tower of Babel.

rrange the room so that each group of three to four children has plenty of floor space. Give each group a set of blocks. Say: Remember the story of the men who thought they would build a tower high enough to reach heaven? God did not let them finish the tower because he wanted the men to understand that believing in him is the only way to heaven. Today we're going to build towers, too. Our towers won't reach heaven either. They'll fall to the ground when they get too high. Let the kids play for several minutes, working together to build the biggest tower they can.

Next, start a new tower and show children how to place the blocks so that it's difficult to get the *next* block to balance. Have them carefully continue to add new blocks until the tower wobbles and falls. As they anticipate the tower falling, have the kids shout out the warning "Oh, no! Look out below!" Let the person who placed the last block place the first one in the next round.




