#### 1 Samuel 16

<sup>14</sup>Now the Spirit of the LORD had departed from Saul, and an evil spirit from the LORD tormented him.

<sup>15</sup>Saul's attendants said to him, "See, an evil spirit from God is tormenting you. <sup>16</sup>Let our lord command his servants here to search for someone who can play the harp. He will play when the evil spirit from God comes upon you, and you will feel better."

<sup>17</sup>So Saul said to his attendants, "Find someone who plays well and bring him to me."

<sup>18</sup>One of the servants answered, "I have seen a son of Jesse of Bethlehem who knows how to play the harp. He is a brave man and a warrior. He speaks well and is a finelooking man. And the LORD is with him." <sup>19</sup>Then Saul sent messengers to Jesse and said, "Send me your son David, who is with the sheep." <sup>20</sup>So Jesse took a donkey loaded with bread, a skin of wine and a young goat and sent them with his son David to Saul.

<sup>21</sup>David came to Saul and entered his service. Saul liked him very much, and David became one of his armorbearers. <sup>22</sup>Then Saul sent word to Jesse, saying, "Allow David to remain in my service, for I am pleased with him."

<sup>23</sup>Whenever the spirit from God came upon Saul, David would take his harp and play. Then relief would come to Saul; he would feel better, and the evil spirit would leave him.



#### 1 Samuel 16:14-23

#### **CRAFT/ACTIVITY: HARPS**

Students will make harps to help remind them that David played a harp for King Saul whenever the evil spirit came to him.

MATERIALS

- 1. Popsicle sticks
- 2. Glue
- 3. Small Rubber bands
- 4. Paper



#### DIRECTIONS

- 1. Pass out four popsicle sticks to each student.
- 2. Have students glue the four sticks together (corner to corner) to in the shape of a square on a piece of paper.
- 3. Tell students to let the sticks to dry overnight.
- 4. Give each student several rubber bands to stretch over the popsicle frame to serve as strings.

#### For Discussion

As students are working on their harps, remind them that David's job was to play the harp when the evil spirit from God came upon him. Saul was pleased with David and made him an armor bearer. As othe memory verse indicates, everything David did, he did for the glory of God.


