⁴Jesus answered, “**It is written: ‘Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.’**”

⁵Then the devil took him to the holy city and had him stand on the highest point of the temple. ⁶“If you are the Son of God,” he said, “throw yourself down. For it is written:

“He will command his angels concerning you,
and they will lift you up in their hands,
so that you will not strike your foot against a stone.”

⁷Jesus answered him, “**It is also written: ‘Do not put the Lord your God to the test.’**”

⁸Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendor. ⁹“All this I will give you,” he said, “if you will bow down and worship me.”

¹⁰Jesus said to him, “**Away from me, Satan! For it is written: ‘Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only.’**”

¹¹Then the devil left him, and angels came and attended him.



THE TEMPTING OF JESUS

Matthew 4:1-11

CRAFT/ACTIVITY: LOAVES OF BREAD

Students will make loaves of bread to remind them that the devil tempted Jesus to turn stones into bread.

MATERIALS

1. 2 cups flour
2. 1 cup salt
3. 2/3 cup water
4. Bowl for mixing
5. Measuring cup
6. Spoon
7. Wax Paper for each student



DIRECTIONS

1. Mix the flour and salt together in a bowl first. Then add in water slowly. Squeeze the dough with your hands until it is smooth. If the play dough is crumbly, add more water. If the play dough is too wet, sprinkle it with flour.
2. Pass out a small piece of wax paper and a small lump of play dough to each student.
3. Help students shape the dough into a loaf of bread.
4. Let loaves air dry for at least a week. Students may take home loaves of bread to air dry.

FOR DISCUSSION

As students are shaping their loaves of bread, remind them that Jesus, though tempted, did not give into the devil. Jesus understands us when we are tempted. We can be encouraged by Jesus as our example.

Have You Ever Sinned?

The Bible teaches that we have *all* sinned and do not measure up to God's glory. It also teaches that the price for sin is death which separates us from God. PRESCHOOL GAME

Supplies: A loaf of bread, children's Bibles, paper crowns or robes, and blankets

Set up these activity stations to follow the story of Jesus' temptation in the wilderness.

Set up three separate areas in your classroom as temptation stations. Say: **Today we're going to learn more about the ways that Satan tempted Jesus in the desert. The first thing Satan tried to get Jesus to do was to change rocks into bread.** At the first station, place children's Bibles and a loaf of bread. Hold up the loaf of bread, and have kids sing this variation of "The B-I-B-L-E.:"

**The B-R-E-A-D—
That's not enough for me.
It feeds my body, not my soul—
The B-R-E-A-D.**

Then have the children hold up the Bible and sing "The B-I-B-L-E."

Walk to the second area, and say: **The second thing Satan tried to get Jesus to do was to jump off a cliff and let angels catch him.** At the second station, lead the children in an imaginary mountain climb. When you arrive at the highest pinnacle, sing "Oh, Be Careful." When you get to the verse about feet, substitute this line: "Be careful, little feet, where you jump."

Walk to the third area, and say: **The third thing Satan tried to get Jesus to do was to worship Satan, not God.** At the third station, have the children try on robes or paper crowns and sit in mock thrones made by throwing blankets over classroom chairs. Have the children sing this song to the tune of "Row, Row, Row Your Boat:"

**No, no, no, I say!
You just go away!
I will worship God alone
And only him obey.**
