¹²After this he went down to Capernaum with his mother and brothers and his disciples. There they stayed for a few days.

¹³When it was almost time for the Jewish Passover. Jesus went up to Jerusalem. ¹⁴In the temple courts he found men selling cattle, sheep and doves, and others sitting at tables exchanging money. ¹⁵So he made a whip out of cords, and drove all from the temple area, both sheep and cattle: he scattered the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. ¹⁶To those who sold doves he said, "Get these out of here! How dare you turn my Father's house into a market!"

¹⁷His disciples remembered that it is written: "Zeal for your house will consume me."

¹⁸Then the Jews demanded of him, "What miraculous sign can you show us to prove your authority to do all this?"

¹⁹Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days."

²⁰The Jews replied, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and you are going to raise it in three days?" ²¹But the temple he had spoken of was his body. ²²After he was raised from the dead, his disciples recalled what he had said. Then they believed the Scripture and the words that Jesus had spoken.

²³Now while he was in Jerusalem at the Passover Feast, many people saw the miraculous signs he was doing and believed in his name. ²⁴But Jesus would not entrust himself to them, for he knew all men. ²⁵He did not need man's testimony about man, for he knew what was in a man.





CRAFT/ACTIVITY: WHIPS

Students will make whips to remind them that Jesus cleared the temple when he saw men selling cattle, sheep, and doves in the temple courts. Jesus made a whip out of cords and drove them from the temple area.

MATERIALS

- 1. Drinking Straws
- 2. Curling Ribbon or Yarn
- 3. Scissors
- 4. Tape

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Pass out one drinking straw to each student.
- 2. Cut pieces of curling ribbon or yarn into 8 inch pieces
- 3. Tape four pieces of curling ribbon or yarn onto the end of each drinking straw.

FOR DISCUSSION


As students are constructing their whips, remind them that Jesus was upset to see the temple being used as a market place. Likewise, Jesus does not want us, as temples of the Holy Spirit, to defile ourselves through sinful behaviors. As our memory verse indicates, the Lord is slow to anger and rich in love. Jesus demonstrated his love by dying on the cross for our sins.

Approximately 10 minutes






