Genesis 32

¹Jacob also went on his way, and the angels of God met him. ²When Jacob saw them, he said, “This is the camp of God!” So he named that place Mahanaim.

³Jacob sent messengers ahead of him to his brother Esau in the land of Seir, the country of Edom. ⁴He instructed them: “This is what you are to say to my master Esau: ‘Your servant Jacob says, I have been staying with Laban and have remained there till now. ⁵I have cattle and donkeys, sheep and goats, menservants and maidservants. Now I am sending this message to my lord, that I may find favor in your eyes.’”

⁶When the messengers returned to Jacob, they said, “We went to your brother Esau, and now he is coming to meet you, and four hundred men are with him.”

⁷In great fear and distress Jacob divided the people who were with him into two groups, and the flocks and herds and camels as well. ⁸He thought, “If Esau comes and attacks one group, the group that is left may escape.”

⁹Then Jacob prayed, “O God of my father Abraham, God of my father Isaac, O LORD, who said to me, ‘Go back to your country and your relatives, and I will make you prosper,’ ¹⁰I am unworthy of all the kindness and faithfulness you have shown your servant. I had only my staff when I crossed this Jordan, but now I have become two groups. ¹¹Save me, I pray, from the hand of my brother Esau, for I am

afraid he will come and attack me, and also the mothers with their children. ¹²But you have said, ‘I will surely make you prosper and will make your descendants like the sand of the sea, which cannot be counted.’”

¹³He spent the night there, and from what he had with him he selected a gift for his brother Esau: ¹⁴two hundred female goats and twenty male goats, two hundred ewes and twenty rams, ¹⁵thirty female camels with their young, forty cows and ten bulls, and twenty female donkeys and ten male donkeys. ¹⁶He put them in the care of his servants, each herd by itself, and said to his servants, “Go ahead of me, and keep some space between the herds.”

¹⁷He instructed the one in the lead: “When my brother Esau meets you and asks, ‘To whom do you belong, and where are you going, and who owns all these animals in front of you?’ ¹⁸then you are to say, ‘They belong to your servant Jacob. They are a gift sent to my lord Esau, and he is coming behind us.’”

¹⁹He also instructed the second, the third and all the others who followed the herds: “You are to say the same thing to Esau when you meet him. ²⁰And be sure to say, ‘Your servant Jacob is coming behind us.’” For he thought, “I will pacify him with these gifts I am sending on ahead; later, when I see him, perhaps he will receive me.” ²¹So Jacob’s gifts went on ahead of him, but he himself spent the night in the camp.



CRAFT/ACTIVITY: A PRESENT FOR ESAU

Students will make a present for Esau to remind them of how Jacob gave a gift of goats, ewes, rams, camels, cows, bulls, donkeys, menservants, and maidservants to pacify his brother.

MATERIALS

1. White 67 lb. Cardstock
2. Gift box pattern
3. Scissors
4. Crayons or markers
5. Tape
6. Yarn or wrapping ribbon



DIRECTIONS

1. Copy the present pattern onto 67 lb. cardstock for each student.
2. Have students color the animals with crayons or markers.
3. Cut out the animals and the gift box on the solid lines.
4. Fold the gift box on the dotted lines and tape the present on two sides.
5. Put the animals inside the gift box.
6. Tape up the other side.
7. Tie yarn or wrapping ribbon around the gift box.

FOR DISCUSSION

As students are working on constructing and filling their gift boxes, remind them how Jacob was attempting to pacify his brother Esau after deceiving him. Esau was tricked out of his birthright and the blessing from his father Isaac. Jacob was worried that Esau might attack him as well as the people with him because when Jacob left, Esau was seeking to kill him. Jacob divided the people and animals into two groups. If one group was attacked, the other group would not be harmed. Esau, upon seeing his brother, embraced him and forgave him. We, like Esau, need to remember to forgive when we are wronged.





JACOB GOES HOME



Jacob was on his way back home to visit his angry brother Esau when angels appeared to him. This reminded Jacob that God was with him as the Lord had

promised.

Jacob sent messengers ahead of him to talk with Esau. Jacob thought Esau would still be mad at him for tricking him out of his birthright and blessing from his father.

The messengers came back and told Jacob that Esau was coming with 400 men! Jacob was scared. Jacob divided his people and animals into two groups. That way, if Esau attacked, only half of his people and animals would die.

Jacob prayed to God for help.

In the morning, Jacob got together hundreds of animals as a gift for his brother. Jacob sent his servants ahead of himself with the animals.

When Jacob and Esau finally met, they hugged and cried. Esau forgave Jacob!
