Matthew 12

¹At that time Jesus went through the grainfields on the Sabbath. His disciples were hungry and began to pick some heads of grain and eat them. ²When the Pharisees saw this, they said to him, "Look! Your disciples are doing what is unlawful on the Sabbath."

³He answered, "Haven't you read what David did when he and his companions were hungry? ⁴He entered the house of God, and he and his companions ate the consecrated bread—which was not lawful for them to do, but only for the priests. ⁵Or haven't you read in the Law that on the Sabbath the priests in the temple desecrate the day and yet are innocent? ⁶I tell you that one greater than the temple is here. ⁷If you had known what these words mean, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice,' you would not have condemned the innocent. 8For the Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath."

⁹Going on from that place, he went into their synagogue, ¹⁰and a man with a shriveled hand was there. Looking for a reason to accuse Jesus, they asked him, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath?"

¹¹He said to them, "If any of you has a sheep and it falls into a pit on the Sabbath, will you not take hold of it and lift it out? ¹²How much more valuable is a man than a sheep! Therefore it is lawful to do good on the Sabbath."

¹³Then he said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." So he stretched it out and it was completely restored, just as sound as the other. ¹⁴But the Pharisees went out and plotted how they might kill Jesus.

¹⁵Aware of this, Jesus withdrew from that place. Many followed him, and he healed all their sick, ¹⁶warning them not to tell who he was.



CRAFT/ACTIVITY: STUFFED HANDS

Students will make "stuffed hands" to remind them that Jesus healed a man's hand that was shriveled.

MATERIALS

- 1. 67 Lb. White Cardstock
- 2. Stuffed Hand Patterns
- 3. Crayons, Markers, or Colored Pencils
- 4. Scissors
- 5. Stapler
- 6. Tissues



DIRECTIONS

- 1. Make a copy of the "Stuffed Hand Patterns" onto 67 lb. cardstock for each student.
- 2. Have students color the two hands.
- 3. Allow students to cut out the two hands.
- 4. Staple the two hands back-to-back leaving an opening large enough to stuff tissue into. This will make the hand look puffy and more life-like.
- 5. Staple the hand shut.

FOR DISCUSSION

As students are assembling their "stuffed hands", remind them that Jesus healed the man regardless of what day it was. Help students realize that Jesus desires mercy, not sacrifice (Matthew 12:7). Christianity is not about following a set of rules; it's about a relationship with Jesus. This story helps illustrate this point.






