Numbers 17

¹The LORD said to Moses,
²“Speak to the Israelites and get twelve staffs from them, one from the leader of each of their ancestral tribes. Write the name of each man on his staff. ³On the staff of Levi write Aaron’s name, for there must be one staff for the head of each ancestral tribe.

⁴Place them in the Tent of Meeting in front of the Testimony, where I meet with you. ⁵The staff belonging to the man I choose will sprout, and I will rid myself of this constant grumbling against you by the Israelites.”

⁶So Moses spoke to the Israelites, and their leaders gave him twelve staffs, one for the leader of each of their ancestral tribes, and Aaron’s staff was among them. ⁷Moses placed the staffs before the LORD in the Tent of the Testimony.

⁸The next day Moses entered the Tent of the Testimony and saw that Aaron’s staff, which

represented the house of Levi, had not only sprouted but had budded, blossomed and produced almonds. ⁹Then Moses brought out all the staffs from the LORD’S presence to all the Israelites. They looked at them, and each man took his own staff.

¹⁰The LORD said to Moses, “Put back Aaron’s staff in front of the Testimony, to be kept as a sign to the rebellious. This will put an end to their grumbling against me, so that they will not die.” ¹¹Moses did just as the LORD commanded him.

¹²The Israelites said to Moses, “We will die! We are lost, we are all lost! ¹³Anyone who even comes near the tabernacle of the LORD will die. Are we all going to die?”

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CRAFT/ACTIVITY: AARON'S STAFF


Students will make a model of Aaron's rod to remind them that Aaron's rod began to bud—a sign that Aaron was chosen as the priest by the Lord.

MATERIALS

1. 67 lb. Cardstock
2. Aaron's Staff Pattern
3. Crayons, Markers, or Colored Pencils
4. Scissors
5. Tape

DIRECTIONS

1. Make copies of the "Aaron's Staff Pattern" for each student.
2. Have students color the flowers and staff (the large rectangle).
3. Roll the rectangle (colored brown) into the shape of a thin cylinder. Tape it together.
4. Tape the flowers to the end of the staff.



FOR DISCUSSION

As students are working on their staff and flowers, remind them that it was Aaron's staff that budded, blossomed and produced almonds. Because of this sign, the Israelites would know that Aaron was chosen by the Lord to be the priest.





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In Israel there were 12 different groups of people. Each group was called a tribe. And each tribe had a leader.

The Lord was tired of the Israelites always complaining about anything and everything including who to follow. The Lord had already destroyed three rebellious leaders and another 250 leaders who had complained to Moses and Aaron.

The Lord told Moses to get a staff (stick) from each of the 12 leaders. Moses was instructed to write each leader's name on their staffs.

The Lord told Moses to put the staffs inside the Tent of the Testimony which was also called the tabernacle. The Lord had a plan to choose a priest for the tabernacle. One of the staffs would begin to sprout, or grow. The next day, Moses went into the tabernacle and saw something amazing. Aaron's staff not only sprouted, but also had beautiful flowers and almonds growing from it! This was a sure sign from the Lord that Aaron, from the tribe of Levi, would be the priest of the tabernacle.

The Lord told Moses to put Aaron's staff in front of the Ark of the Covenant to be a reminder to the rebellious people that the Lord had chosen Aaron to lead them.
